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The **Triumph TR3** is a sports car that was produced by the British automaker Triumph from 1962 to 1965. The TR3B was an updated version of the Triumph TR3 and TR3A, with some improvements and changes that set the model apart. The TR3B was produced alongside the TR4, as Triumph dealers feared that the TR4 would not be well received.

Key features of the Triumph TR3B:

Design and Styling:
